## From the Assistant Rector

EAR Sisters and Brothers,

I joked a few sermons ago that with all of our feeding ministries and food-centered events, we should be known as "St. James's's: The Church that Feed's's's."

- We collect incredible amounts of non-perishable food items throughout the year for the Hartford Catholic Worker and the West Hartford Food Bank.
- We have a dedicated team of gardeners who bring from the earth delicious vegetables that also go toward our feeding ministries.
- We frequently gather around food to raise awareness and funding for things like the youth mission trip/pilgrimage, the choir, and to celebrate community with events like the Taste of St. James's and the Strawberry Festival.
- After most Sunday services, we have either coffee hour or lemonade on the lawn, giving us a weekly chance to check in and put names to familiar faces.
- And Ellen even facilitated a book study of Eat with Joy, a book about "Redeeming God's Gift of Food."


We are "St. James's's: The Church that Feed's's's," yet we are not finished growing. There is no telling who will walk through our doors, and we do not know what gifts they will bring to this community. This makes one wonder: How will we respond to the newcomers? How will St. James's grow because of their unique personalities and talents? How will we respond to their needs when they arrive—or even before they step foot in the building?

Each Sunday when we "Go in peace to love and serve the Lord," we seek to carry on the commission that Jesus gave to his disciples to be "fishers of people."

If, for too long, we think that we've finished growing, we become like the foolish fisher who places a fish tank next to an ocean hoping that all of the fish will jump in on their own.


They won't, and why should they? The point of church isn't to fill our tank with our kind of fish; the point of church is to dump ourselves back into the ocean every week to swim in the waters of authentic relationship with Christ and then to invite others into that relationship.

Treasurer's Report



#### St. James's Treasury Report Reported Results Year to Date through April, 2014

**Current Position:** Even though the seasons are changing, the church finds itself in a position similar to what has been reported during the first few months of this year as well as most of 2013. Specifically, the church faces an overall shortfall of more than \$15,000 and most of that figure is due to income that is lower than expected through this point in the year. At the end of March, we also faced a smaller shortfall of \$11,000. Most of the \$15,797 shortfall on the income side is due to pledge income that trails our budget by \$13,375 through the end of April. Expenses are tracking closely to budget. A full review of pledge payment experience is currently underway.

#### Income & Expense Summary:

**Income:** Year-to-date (YTD) actual income is \$15,797 below budget (or 4.9% worse than budget). This figure is worse than last month when income trailed budget by \$8,642 (3.6% of budget).

**Expense:** YTD expenses are tracking very close to budget, \$429 (or 0.2%) below budget as compared to \$2,360 above budget as of the end of March.

A mentor of mine says that authentic relationship with Jesus Christ "is the very water in which the fish live and move and have their being," and that means that churches accept people as they are and encourage them to express who they are. The acceptance part is getting better and better, especially in mainline churches like ours; the encouragement piece, however, is a growing edge.

Where do we go from here? What more can we do "in the tank" to better prepare ourselves for the Monday through Saturday ocean?

This is our chance to dream a little—to think about who we are becoming as St. James's and as individuals. If this sounds broad, it's because it is—it has got to start this way because we are in brainstorming mode...

What if we held a monthly brunch after services open to the community, free to newcomers, and put together by different groupings in St. James's (choir, vestry, "First Friday" families, etc.)? What if we supported the LGBT community by hosting a post-Pride event (if Pride is a thing in Hartford)? What if we turned the youth room into a café for high schoolers to drink coffee and do their homework somewhere besides home?

What would happen if we got even more creative about what we *do* to further our mission of learning, living, and teaching the values of the Gospel of Jesus Christ? When we get creative and tap into our history, identity, and vision, who knows where authentic relationship with Jesus Christ will take us?

A recent edition of Radio Free Babylon's "Coffee With Jesus" comic strip has Jesus—java in hand—saying, "Come as you are, but don't stay as you came."

Indeed. We are members of the Body of Christ, and we are evolving and deepening our relationship with God.

When he first came to us, So young, we did enquire, Was he here to lead – daunting task, indeed – Or to join our boys' choir? *Refrain* 


When the Gospel was done Great improvs he'd create, Based on day or song, sometimes ran too long, Poor Bob just had to wait! *Refrain*

## Walk Against Hunger Update

HE St. James's Walk Team raised \$1,430 for the 31st annual Foodshare Walk Against Hunger. Together with a \$450 contribution from the Outreach fund, a total of \$1,880 was donated for the benefit of Loaves and Fishes Ministries.

## JUNE OUTREACH Toilet Paper & Paper Towel Collection

**R**ESPONDING to requests from those in need and the agencies that serve them, the outreach focus for June will be the everpopular toilet paper collection, and we are also now collecting paper towels. With a lack of money for food affecting many of the people in need, donations of other necessities -- such as toilet paper -- have become increasingly valued. It is as simple as having a new backpack filled with pencils, notebooks and things they need to help them learn. The children in these programs need our help to ensure they are prepared to learn.


