





THE GOSPEL

*Luke 13:10-17**Priest* The Holy Gospel of our Savior Jesus Christ, according to Luke.*People* **Glory to you, O Lord.**

Now Jesus was teaching in one of the synagogues on the sabbath. And just then there appeared a woman with a spirit that had crippled her for eighteen years. She was bent over and was quite unable to stand up straight. When Jesus saw her, he called her over and said, "Woman, you are set free from your ailment." When he laid his hands on her, immediately she stood up straight and began praising God. But the leader of the synagogue, indignant because Jesus had cured on the sabbath, kept saying to the crowd, "There are six days on which work ought to be done; come on those days and be cured, and not on the sabbath day." But the Lord answered him and said, "You hypocrites! Does not each of you on the sabbath untie his ox or his donkey from the manger, and lead it away to give it water? 





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Celebrant continues:

We give thanks to you, O God, for the goodness and love which you have made known to us in creation; in the calling of Israel to be your people; in your Word spoken through the prophets; and above all in the Word made flesh, Jesus, your Son. For in these last days you sent him to be incarnate from the Virgin Mary, to be the Savior and Redeemer of the world. In him, you have delivered us from evil, and made us worthy to stand before you. In him, you have brought us out of error into truth, out of sin into righteousness, out of death into life. On the night before he died for us, our Lord Jesus Christ took bread; and when he had given thanks to you, he broke it, and gave it to his disciples, and said, "Take, eat: This is my Body, which is given for you. Do this for the remembrance of me." After supper he took the cup of wine; and when he had given thanks, he gave it to them, and said, "Drink this, all of you: This is my Blood of the new Covenant, which is shed for you and for many for the forgiveness of sins. Whenever you drink it, do this for the remembrance of me." Therefore, according to his command,

COMMUNION MUSIC *Prière après la Communion* Olivier Messiaen (1908-1998)

French composer and organist Olivier Messiaen was known for his deeply spiritual music, often inspired Gregorian chant, sounds of nature (especially birdsong), and his devout Catholic faith. This "Prayer after Communion" from his Messe de la Pentecôte (1950) can be experienced as an intimate meditation with gentle, repetitive harmonies creating a trance-like sense of stillness in response to the Eucharist.

POSTLUDE

Fugue in F, BuxWV 144

Dietrich Buxtehude (c. 1637–1707)

Dieterich Buxtehude was a Danish-German composer and organist whose imaginative and virtuosic works were central to the North German organ tradition during the Baroque era.

While the organist at the Marienkirche in Lübeck, Buxtehude became renowned for his Abendmusik concerts, which were offered for free to the public. At the age of 20, a young J.S. Bach famously walked an arduous 250 miles to meet Buxtehude and hear his music.

FOOD PANTRY NEEDS (please notice additions)


