THE LESSON

Hebrews 13:1-8, 15-16

Let mutual love continue. Do not neglect to show hospitality to strangers, for by doing that some have entertained angels without knowing it. Remember those who are in prison, as though you were in prison with them; those who are being tortured, as though you yourselves were being tortured. Let marriage be held in honor by all, and let the marriage bed be kept undefiled; for God will judge fornicators and

adulterers. Keep your lives free from the love of money, and be content with what you have; for he has said, "I will never leave you or forsake you." THE GOSPEL

*Luke 14:1, 7-14**Priest* The Holy Gospel of our Savior Jesus Christ, according to Luke.*People* **Glory to you, O Lord.**

On one occasion when Jesus was going to the house of a leader of the Pharisees to eat a meal on the sabbath, they were watching him closely. When he noticed how the guests chose the places of honor, he told them a parable. "When you are invited by someone to a wedding banquet, do not sit down at the place of honor, in case someone more distinguished than you has been invited by your host; and the host who invited both of you may come and say to you, 'Give this person your place,' and then in disgrace you would start to take the lowest place. But when you are invited, go and sit down at the lowest place, so that when your host comes, he may say to you, 'Friend, move up higher'; then you will be honored in the presence of all who sit at the table with you. For all who exalt themselves will be humbled, and those who humble themselves will be exalted." He said also to the one who had invited him, "When you give a luncheon or a dinner, do not invite your friends or your brothers or your relatives or rich neighbors, in case they may invite you in return, and you would be repaid. But when you give a banquet, invite the poor, the crippled, the lame, and the blind. And you will be blessed, because they cannot repay you, for you will be repaid at the resurrection of the righteous."

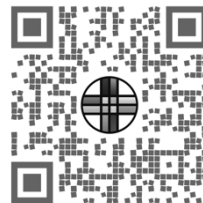

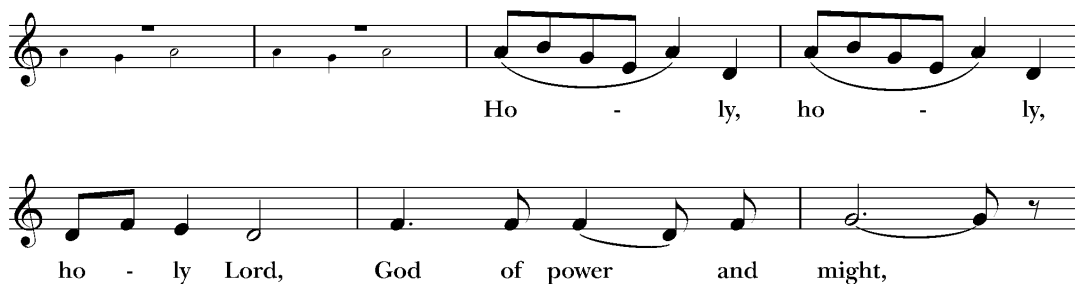
THE LITURGY OF THE TABLE


AT THE OFFERTORY Summerland William Grant Still (1895-1978)

Known as the “Dean of African American Composers”, Still was a pioneering American composer, conductor, and arranger. Trained in both classical and popular traditions, he broke barriers as the first African American to conduct a major U.S. symphony orchestra and to have an opera produced by a major company. His music blends classical forms with African American spirituals, blues, and jazz, creating a uniquely American voice that is both richly expressive and deeply rooted in cultural heritage.

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Celebrant continues:

We give thanks to you, O God, for the goodness and love which you have made known to us in creation; in the calling of Israel to be your people; in your Word spoken through the prophets; and above all in the Word made flesh, Jesus, your Son. For in these last days you sent him to be incarnate from the Virgin Mary, to be the Savior and Redeemer of the world. In him, you have delivered us from evil, and made us worthy to stand before you. In him, you have brought us out of error into truth, out of sin into righteousness, out of death into life. On the night before he died for us, our Lord Jesus Christ took bread; and when he had given thanks to you, he broke it, and gave it to his disciples, and said, "Take, eat: This is my Body, which is given for you. Do this for the remembrance of me." After supper he took the cup of wine; and when he had given thanks, he gave it to them, and said, "Drink this, all of you: This is my Blood of the new Covenant, which is shed for you and for many for the forgiveness of sins. Whenever you drink it, do this for the remembrance of me." Therefore, according to his command,

Unite us to your Son in his sacrifice, that we may be acceptable through him, being sanctified by the Holy Spirit. In the fullness of time, put all things in subjection under your Christ, and bring us to that heavenly country where, with all your saints, we may enter the everlasting heritage of your sons and daughters; through Jesus Christ our Lord, the firstborn of all creation, the head of the Church, and the author of our salvation.

By him, and with him, and in him, in the unity of the Holy Spirit all honor and glory is yours, Almighty God, now and forever. **AMEN.**

COMMUNION MUSIC *Land of Rest* arr. George Shearing (1919-2011)

Blind from birth, British jazz musician George Shearing achieved international fame for his sophisticated harmonies and seamless blending of jazz and classical influences. He is perhaps best known for his song “Lullaby of Birdland” (1952), which has become a jazz standard, performed by countless bands in the decades since.

POSTLUDE *Postlude in D* Cecil Armstrong Gibbs (1889–1960)

Gibbs was an English composer best remembered for his prolific output of art songs, choral music, and works for amateur musicians. Educated at Cambridge and the Royal College of Music, he often drew inspiration from English poetry and pastoral scenes. A contemporary of Vaughan Williams and Holst, Gibbs embraced a tonal, folk-inflected style that remained warmly accessible throughout his career, endearing him to choirs and audiences alike.

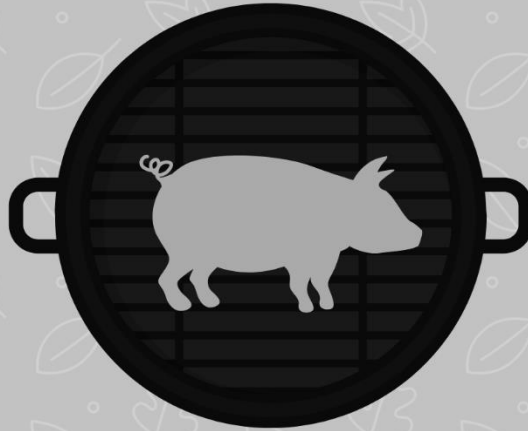
