THE LESSON Isaiah 40:1-11

Comfort, O comfort my people, says your God. Speak tenderly to Jerusalem, and cry to her that she has served her term, that her penalty is paid, that she has received

from the Lord's hand double for all her sins. A voice cries out: "In the wilderness prepare the way of the Lord, make straight in the desert a highway for our God. Every valley shall be lifted up, and every mountain and hill be made low; the uneven ground shall become level, and the rough places a plain. Then the glory of the Lord shall be revealed, and all people shall see it together, for the mouth of the Lord has spoken." A voice says, "Cry out!" And I said, "What shall I cry?" All people are grass, their constancy is like the flower of the field. The grass withers, the flower fades, when the breath of the Lord blows upon it; surely the people are grass. The grass withers, the flower fades; but the word of our God will stand for ever. Get you up to a high mountain, O Zion, herald of good tidings; lift up your voice with strength, O Jerusalem, herald of good tidings, lift it up, do not fear; say to the cities of Judah, "Here is your God!" 



As of three weeks ago we have prepared and delivered, since the end of August, 312 family dinners = 1352 meals.

I am excited to announce that we have a new partner in this important effort. The Empty Bowls Club of Hall High School is now providing baked goods that they will prepare in their homes on a weekly basis. Empty Bowls is a community service student-led club dedicated to fighting hunger in West Hartford and Connecticut. Students raise awareness, educate the school community, organize events around various food insecurity and hunger awareness issues, organize school-wide food drives, sponsor an annual Empty Bowls Banquet Fundraiser, and provide baked goods for local organizations in need of donations. There are also club activities such as making sandwiches for soup kitchens and bake sales to support local food-oriented charities.




