THE LESSON

Isaiah 49:1-7

Listen to me, O coastlands, pay attention, you peoples from far away! The Lord called me before I was born, while I was in my mother's womb he named me. He made my mouth like a sharp sword, in the shadow of his hand he hid me; he made me a polished arrow, in his quiver he hid me away. And he said to me, "You are my servant, Israel, in whom I will be glorified." But I said, "I have labored in vain, I have spent my strength for nothing and vanity; yet surely my cause is with the Lord, and

John 1:29-42

Priest The Holy Gospel of our Savior Jesus Christ, according to John.

People **Glory to you, O Lord.**

John saw Jesus coming toward him and declared, "Here is the Lamb of God who takes away the sin of the world! This is he of whom I said, 'After me comes a man who ranks ahead of me because he was before me.' I myself did not know him; but I came baptizing with water for this reason, that he might be revealed to Israel." And John testified, "I saw the Spirit descending from heaven like a dove, and it remained on him. I myself did not know him, but the one who sent me to baptize with water said to me, 'He on whom you see the Spirit descend and remain is the one who baptizes with the Holy Spirit.' And I myself have seen and have testified that this is the Son of God." The next day John again was standing with two of his disciples, and

as he watched Jesus walk by, he exclaimed, “Look, here is the Lamb of God!” The two disciples heard him say this, and they followed Jesus. When Jesus turned and saw them following, he said to them, “What are you looking for?” They said to him, “Rabbi” (which translated means Teacher), “where are you staying?” He said to them, “Come and see.” They came and saw where he was staying, and they remained with him that day. It was about four o’clock in the afternoon. One of the two who heard John speak and followed him was Andrew, Simon Peter’s brother. He first found his brother Simon and said to him, “We have found the Messiah” (which is translated Anointed). He brought Simon to Jesus, who looked at him and said, “You are Simon son of John. You are to be called Cephas” (which is translated Peter).



THE LITURGY OF THE TABLE

AT THE OFFERTORY *I Believe This is Jesus* Undine Smith Moore (1904-1989)

Moore grew up in Virginia during the Jim Crow era as the granddaughter of slaves and went on to pursue music at Fisk University, Columbia University, and the Juilliard School, which she graduated cum laude in 1926. She later co-founded the Black Music Center at Virginia State College, where she was a professor for almost 50 years while maintaining a career as a composer. She has been called the "Dean of Black Women Composers."

COMMUNION MUSIC *Heavenly Light* Alexander Kopylov (1854-1911)

Trained at the Moscow Conservatory in the Russian Orthodox tradition, Kopylov spent much of his career as a teacher and church musician, shaping a generation of Russian composers. His setting of Sveti Tikhij (translated here as “Heavenly Light”) is characteristic of late-19th-century Russian sacred music.

POSTLUDE *Music for a Festival* Calvin Hampton (1938-1984)

Calvin Hampton was appointed organist of Calvary Episcopal Church in New York City at just 20 years old, a position he held for over two decades while also building an international reputation as a performer, composer, and advocate for new music, before his untimely death as an early victim of the AIDS epidemic. Deeply rooted in the Episcopal liturgical tradition yet stylistically adventurous, Hampton wrote music that fused rhythmic vitality, bold harmonic language, and a keen sense of drama.
