THE LESSON

*1 Corinthians 12:1-11*

Now concerning spiritual gifts, brothers and sisters, I do not want you to be uninformed. You know that when you were pagans, you were enticed and led astray to idols that could not speak. Therefore I want you to understand that no one speaking by the Spirit of God ever says "Let Jesus be cursed!" and no one can say "Jesus is Lord" except by the Holy Spirit. Now there are varieties of gifts, but the same Spirit; and there are varieties of services, but the same Lord; and there are varieties of activities, but it is the same God who activates all of them in everyone. To each is given the manifestation of the Spirit for the common good. To one is given through the Spirit the utterance of wisdom, and to another the utterance of knowledge according to the same Spirit, to another faith by the same Spirit, to another gifts of healing by the one Spirit, to another the working of miracles, to another prophecy, to another the discernment of spirits, to another various kinds of tongues, to another the interpretation of tongues. All these are activated by one and the same Spirit, who allots to each one individually just as the Spirit chooses.

## THE GOSPEL

*John 2:1-11*

*Priest* The Holy Gospel of our Savior Jesus Christ, according to John.

On the third day there was a wedding in Cana of Galilee, and the mother of Jesus was there. Jesus and his disciples had also been invited to the wedding. When the wine gave out, the mother of Jesus said to him, "They have no wine." And Jesus said to her, "Woman, what concern is that to you and to me? My hour has not yet come." His mother said to the servants, "Do whatever he tells you." Now standing there were six stone water jars for the Jewish rites of purification, each holding twenty or thirty gallons. Jesus said to them, "Fill the jars with water." And they filled them up to the brim. He said to them, "Now draw some out, and take it to the chief steward." So they took it. When the steward tasted the water that had become wine, and did not know where it came from (though the servants who had drawn the water knew), the steward called the bridegroom and said to him, "Everyone serves the good wine first, and then the inferior wine after the guests have become drunk. But you have kept the good wine until now." Jesus did this, the first of his signs, in Cana of Galilee, and revealed his glory; and his disciples believed in him.

## New Vestry Member Profiles

**Bob Bausmith** is a recently retired management consultant with a passion for leadership development, strategic planning, and transformational change with a Strong commitment to St. James's and performing arts in the Greater Hartford area. He has been a member of the St. James's Choir since January 2016 and became actively involved with the Ray Payne / David Thomas Men's Discussion Group soon thereafter. Bob grew up at Morrow Memorial Church, a large Methodist church in Maplewood, NJ, where he was actively involved in the choir program and studied organ. In high school, he would drive to the Cathedral Basilica of the Sacred Heart in Newark, NJ to hear the 28-year-old organist, John Rose, in recital. When he arrived at Lehigh University, he befriended the university organist who arranged for him to get a key to the chapel - home of the Bethlehem Bach Festival. In his senior year, Bob took a part-time job as interim Organist and Choir Director at Grace Evangelical Lutheran Church in Allentown, PA. While in college, he spent two summers in Burlington, VT working a co-op assignment at IBM. A friend encouraged him to visit the Cathedral Church of St. Paul (Episcopal) where he joined the summer choir and was allowed to practice the organ on a regular basis (after befriending the verger). Upon graduating, Bob took a full-time engineering position at IBM and supplemented his income with a part-time job as Assistant Organist at the First Congregational Church of Essex Junction. While there he helped to spearhead the installation of a new pipe organ and arranged the dedicatory recital. In 1987, Bob's family moved to Glastonbury, CT where he joined the St. James Choir. As his girls got older, they started attending First Church of Christ in Wethersfield, where Bob met David Spicer, Founder of the Albert Schweitzer Organ Festival. He sang in the choir and served as a substitute organist on numerous occasions. When Bob remarried in 2005, he moved to West Hartford.



**Doug Compton (one year term)** has been a member of St. James's Church for twelve years. His first introduction to St. James's was an invitation from the Cobbs to make casseroles after the 8:00 service. Bill Harris sang a song or two and the conversation was lively. It was a wonderful group of people contributing to an amazing program. As Doug learned more about the St. James's family and their community programs, it was clear he had found a home at St. James's. The parishioners were externally focused, actively engaged in the community and had plenty of opportunities for all to participate. For the first time in his life, Doug felt St. James's offered an opportunity to reach out and support the local community in a tangible way.
