THE LESSON

*Genesis 15:1-12, 17-18*

The word of the Lord came to Abram in a vision, "Do not be afraid, Abram, I am your shield; your reward shall be very great." But Abram said, "O Lord God, what will you give me, for I continue childless, and the heir of my house is Eliezer of Damascus?" And Abram said, "You have given me no offspring, and so a slave born in my house is to be my heir." But the word of the Lord came to him, "This man shall not be your heir; no one but your very own issue shall be your heir." He brought him outside and said, "Look toward heaven and count the stars, if you are able to count them." Then he said to him, "So shall your descendants be." And he believed the Lord; and the Lord reckoned it to him as righteousness. Then he said to him, "I am the Lord who brought you from Ur of the Chaldeans, to give you this land to possess." But he said, "O Lord God, how am I to know that I shall possess it?" 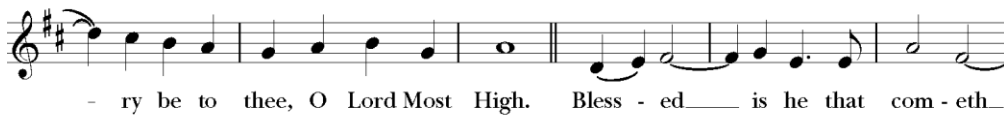

## CHILDREN'S SUNDAY LENTEN PROGRAM AT ST. JAMES'S

At KFC (Kids for Christ aka Sunday School) this Lent, we have been exploring Gospel passages that remind us that God is still with us using a curriculum from Illustrated Ministries. In this curriculum we will explore the Good News of the gospel, and Jesus' experience in the fullness of his humanity—comfort and pain, celebration and heartache, joy and suffering. We will talk about how the life of Jesus demonstrates that God knows what it is to be human and to be with us in all our experiences, especially in our suffering. Starting with the First Sunday in Lent and going through Easter, each weekly session will have a Scripture reading, reflection, and coloring pages which we will use during KFC. The kids will bring home discussion questions and prayers to share with their families during the week.

## MEN'S DISCUSSION GROUP

- Moisturizer or hand cream
- Body wash
- Deodorant - for men, women or uni-sex
- Bar soap (Dove and Ivory have great fragrance-free options)

- Shaving cream, Dental Floss, Combs, and Mini Kleenex packs, Lip Balm, etc.
