Whether or not it was the composer's intent, many listeners of this selection claim to hear elements of a twinkling star in a wandering "pipe call"; the musical portrayal of searching shepherds who traverse foreign lands as a tuneful although rhythmically disjointed repeated passage; and even - perhaps comically - the crunch of snow under footsteps in the opening section which features slow, separated, "crunchy" chords. Although arguably one of Messiaen's most tonally accessible works, this second movement in his Nativity Suite is unmistakably his singular musical language, combining elements of non-retrogradable rhythms, hints at numerology and birdsong, as well as its tonal center which is neither major or minor, specifically, but rather one of his "modes of limited transposition." In his own words it is, "une sorte de Noël" or "a kind of Christmas melody."

Hebrews 10:5-10

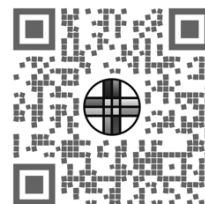

AT THE OFFERTORY *Magnificat in E-flat Major* Charles Wood (1866-1926)

A student of Charles Villiers Stanford and Charles H.H. Parry at the Royal College of Music (London), Wood was a prominent Irish organist, teacher, and composer of Anglican music, with 250 sacred works by the end of his life. He also continued in his teachers' footsteps as a professor at his alma mater where he mentored notable students including Ralph Vaughan Williams and Herbert Howells.

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Celebrant continues:

We acclaim you, holy God, glorious in power. Your mighty works reveal your wisdom and love. You formed us in your own image, giving the whole world into our care, so that, in obedience to you, our Creator, we might rule and serve all your creatures. When our disobedience took us far from you, you did not abandon us to the power of death. In your mercy you came to our help, so that in seeking you we

might find you. Again and again you called us into covenant with you, and through the prophets you taught us to hope for salvation.

Holy God, you loved the world so much that in the fullness of time you sent your only Son to be our Savior. Incarnate by the Holy Spirit, born of the Virgin Mary, he lived as one of us, yet without sin. To the poor he proclaimed the good news of salvation; to prisoners, freedom; to the sorrowful, joy. To fulfill your purpose he gave himself up to death; and, rising from the grave, destroyed death, and made the whole creation new.

And, that we might live no longer for ourselves, but for Christ who died and rose for us, you sent the Holy Spirit, your own first gift for those who believe, to complete your work in the world, and to bring to fulfillment the sanctification of all.

When the hour had come for Jesus to be glorified by you, his heavenly Father, having loved his own who were in the world, he loved them to the end; at supper with them Jesus took bread, and when he had given thanks to you, he broke it, and gave it to his disciples, and said, "Take, eat: This is my Body, which is given for you. Do this for the remembrance of me."

After supper Jesus took the cup of wine; and when he had given thanks, he gave it to them, and said, "Drink this, all of you: This is my Blood of the new Covenant, which is shed for you and for many for the forgiveness of sins. Whenever you drink it, do this for the remembrance of me."

Almighty God, we now celebrate this memorial of our redemption. Recalling Christ's death and descent among the dead, proclaiming Christ's resurrection and ascension to your right hand, awaiting Christ's coming in glory; and offering to you, from the gifts you have given us, this bread and this cup, we praise you and we bless you.
