PRELUDE *Méditation* Maurice Duruflé (1902-1986)

Composed in 1964, *Méditation* is one of Duruflé's final works. A consummate perfectionist, he was known for obsessive editing and numerous drafts. As a result, his compositional output totals a mere 14 works, but each is considered to be of the highest musical caliber. He studied at the Paris Conservatoire and served as organist of St. Etienne-du-Mont for 55 years.

John 10:1-10

Priest The Holy Gospel of our Savior Jesus Christ, according to John.

People **Glory to you, O Lord.**

Jesus said, "Very truly, I tell you, anyone who does not enter the sheepfold by the gate but climbs in by another way is a thief and a bandit. The one who enters by the

gate is the shepherd of the sheep. The gatekeeper opens the gate for him, and the sheep hear his voice. He calls his own sheep by name and leads them out. When he has brought out all his own, he goes ahead of them, and the sheep follow him because they know his voice. They will not follow a stranger, but they will run from him because they do not know the voice of strangers.” Jesus used this figure of speech with them, but they did not understand what he was saying to them. So again Jesus said to them, “Very truly, I tell you, I am the gate for the sheep. All who came before me are thieves and bandits; but the sheep did not listen to them. I am the gate. Whoever enters by me will be saved, and will come in and go out and find pasture. The thief comes only to steal and kill and destroy. I came that they may have life, and have it abundantly.”

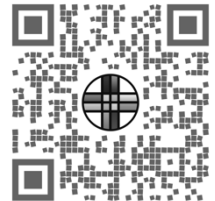

THE LITURGY OF THE TABLE

OFFERTORY ANTHEM *Jubilate Deo* Benjamin Britten (1913-1976)

Composed in 1961, Jubilate Deo in C by Benjamin Britten was written for St Nicholas Church Aldeburgh, and intended as a companion to his earlier Te Deum in C. The work sets Psalm 100, a text traditionally associated with joy, praise, and thanksgiving. Unlike many grand, ceremonial settings of the Jubilate, Britten's approach is strikingly fresh and playful. The organ introduces a lively, almost dance-like character, with bright rhythms and crisp articulations that propel the choir forward. Throughout the piece, Britten delights in word painting: buoyant melodic figures for "be joyful," imitative entries that suggest communal praise, and moments of lyrical warmth that reflect the text's gentler lines.



Simon Preston (1938-2022)

Educated at King's College Cambridge, Preston first came to prominence as Organ Scholar there, later serving as Sub-Organist at Westminster Abbey before returning to Cambridge as Organist and Master of the Choristers. Alleluyas showcases Preston's affinity for color, momentum, and clarity of texture. Its sparkling figuration and driving rhythmic patterns suggest an exultant, almost improvisatory response to the idea of "alleluia," transforming a familiar word of praise into a vivid musical tapestry.


