The message about the cross is foolishness to those who are perishing, but to us who are being saved it is the power of God. For it is written, "I will destroy the wisdom of the wise, and the discernment of the discerning I will thwart." Where is the one who is wise? Where is the scribe? Where is the debater of this age? Has not God made foolish the wisdom of the world? For since, in the wisdom of God, the world did not know God through wisdom, God decided, through the foolishness of our proclamation, to save those who believe. For Jews demand signs and Greeks desire

wisdom, but we proclaim Christ crucified, a stumbling block to Jews and foolishness to Gentiles, but to those who are the called, both Jews and Greeks, Christ the power of God and the wisdom of God. For God's foolishness is wiser than human wisdom, and God's weakness is stronger than human strength. Consider your own call, brothers and sisters: not many of you were wise by human standards, not many were powerful, not many were of noble birth. But God chose what is foolish in the world to shame the wise; God chose what is weak in the world to shame the strong; God chose what is low and despised in the world, things that are not, to reduce to nothing things that are, so that no one might boast in the presence of God. He is the source of your life in Christ Jesus, who became for us wisdom from God, and righteousness and sanctification and redemption, in order that, as it is written, "Let the one who boasts, boast in the Lord."

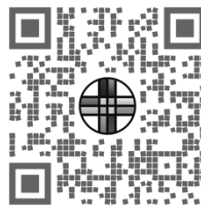



"I'm Gonna Sing 'Til the Spirit Moves" exemplifies Hogan's signature style: rhythmically charged, gospel-inflected, and rooted in the call-and-response traditions of the Black church.

Light of the World (Choristers of St. James's)

Sir John Dankworth (1927-2010)

Best known for his work as a jazz saxophonist, bandleader, and conductor across many genres, British composer Dankworth sets this text with clarity and warmth, using gentle rhythmic flow and luminous harmonies to convey the image of divine light as guidance. His jazz background is evident in the meandering progression, chords that are rich in extended tertian harmonies.

Each Lent we prepare Easter "baskets" for approximately 200 of our neighbors living in Hartford area shelters and transitional housing. The bulk go to women and families, although there are also men in the group. The items listed are the most needed. 14-20 ounce containers are great and allow us to fit more items into the bags. Please consider buying fragrance-free or non-allergenic items. Children living in shelters often have asthma which is triggered by highly fragranced products. Items needed: Full/Large size: conditioner, body wash (no bar soap), moisturizer or hand cream, sunscreen, deodorant for men, women or uni-sex; disposable razors for men, women or uni-sex; shaving cream/gel, combs, lip balm, and shower caps, men's underwear sizes M-XXL, women's underwear sizes S-XL. Sample/Hotel: purse packs of tissues, body wash, 2-1 shampoo/conditioner, shaving cream (smaller size), lotion/moisturizer. Drop your donations off in the Cloister or make a monetary donation and we will shop for you. Simply put "Easter Baskets" in the memo line. We will gather to fill the bags on **Palm Sunday, March 29** after the 9:30 service in the parish hall.
