THE LESSON

Colossians 3:1-11

If you have been raised with Christ, seek the things that are above, where Christ is, seated at the right hand of God. Set your minds on things that are above, not on things that are on earth, for you have died, and your life is hidden with Christ in God. When Christ who is your life is revealed, then you also will be revealed with him in glory. Put to death, therefore, whatever in you is earthly: fornication, impurity, passion, evil desire, and greed (which is idolatry). On account of these the

wrath of God is coming on those who are disobedient. These are the ways you also once followed, when you were living that life. But now you must get rid of all such things~ anger, wrath, malice, slander, and abusive language from your mouth. Do not lie to one another, seeing that you have stripped off the old self with its practices and have clothed yourselves with the new self, which is being renewed in knowledge according to the image of its creator. In that renewal there is no longer Greek and Jew, circumcised and uncircumcised, barbarian, Scythian, slave and free; but Christ is all and in all!

We pray for those celebrating birthdays, especially Abigail Collin and Luna Maguire.

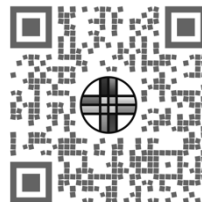
We pray for our parish, our extended parish family, our needs, and those of others.

We greet one another in the name of Christ.

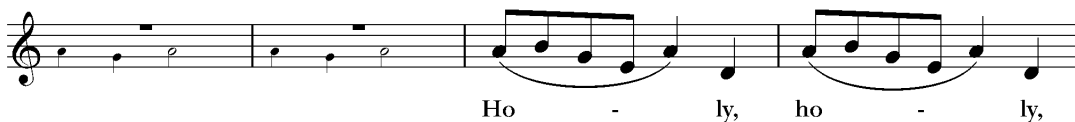




Hungarian-German composer and theorist Zsolt Gárdonyi is renowned for his inventive fusion of classical tradition with jazz idioms. His work “Mozart Changes” reimagined the finale of Mozart’s K. 576 with jazz harmonies and swing rhythms, while his “EGATOP” paid tribute to jazz legends Erroll Garner, Art Tatum, and Oscar Peterson. He served as Professor of Music Theory for decades at the Hochschule für Musik Würzburg in Germany and has received international recognition for his scholarship on the fugue structures of Bach.

Celebrant continues:

We give thanks to you, O God, for the goodness and love which you have made known to us in creation; in the calling of Israel to be your people; in your Word spoken through the prophets; and above all in the Word made flesh, Jesus, your Son. For in these last days you sent him to be incarnate from the Virgin Mary, to be the Savior and Redeemer of the world. In him, you have delivered us from evil, and made us worthy to stand before you. In him, you have brought us out of error into truth, out of sin into righteousness, out of death into life. On the night before he died for us, our Lord Jesus Christ took bread; and when he had given thanks to you, he broke it, and gave it to his disciples, and said, "Take, eat: This is my Body, which is given for you. Do this for the remembrance of me." After supper he took the cup of wine; and when he had given thanks, he gave it to them, and said, "Drink this, all of you: This is my Blood of the new Covenant, which is shed for you and for many for the forgiveness of sins. His influence extended across Europe, notably inspiring a young Haydn and contributing a prolific output that includes sacred works, chamber music, and over 70 symphonies.
