Ephesians 1:11-23

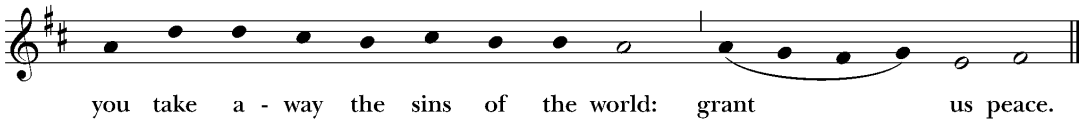

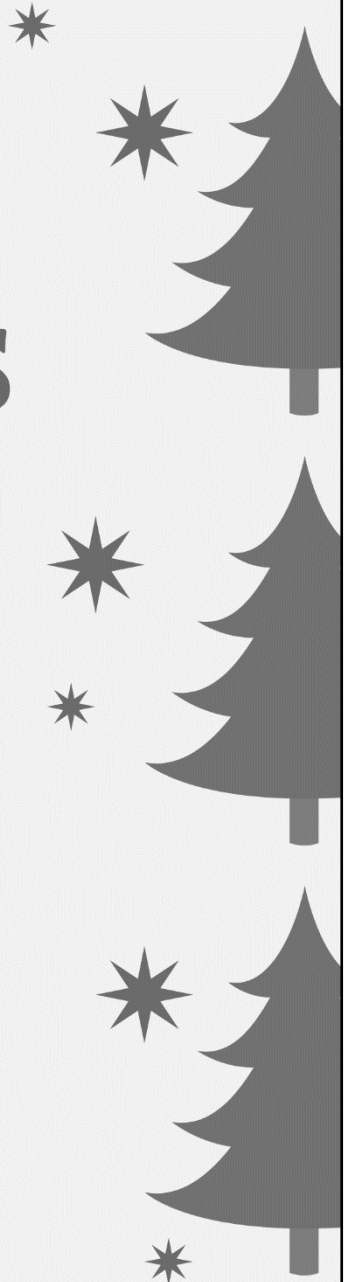
