ORGAN VOLUNTARY Prelude on an Old Folk Tune Amy Marcy Beach (1867-1944)

Beach's "Gaelic Symphony" - premiered by the Boston Symphony Orchestra in 1896 - was the first symphony composed and published by an American woman and, after premiering her piano concerto with major symphonies across Germany in 1913, critics wrote that she was the first American woman "able to compose music of a European quality of excellence." As a child, she was known for being able to sing 40 tunes by the age of 1 and improvise counter melodies by the age of 2. In the last couple decades of her life, she served as the first president of the Society of American Women Composers and established various "Beach Clubs" to help provide music education for children.




People Have mercy, Lord, for we are sinners in your sight.
