From the Assistant Rector

EAR St. James's Family,

As I look out on this new year, on the edge between the season of Epiphany and the beginning of Lent, I am humbled by how many challenges are before us as a church. The terrain of ministry is increasingly difficult. We live in a painful political

moment that presses the needs of marginalized communities into our attention. Meaningful conversations with neighbors and family are increasingly difficult in an age of extreme polarization. Younger neighbors increasingly have fewer meaningful connections with the church, presenting us with perplexing questions about what church growth might or could look like in the coming generation. There are no easy solutions as to how we can live and grow as a loving Christian community in this setting. While I can sometimes be overwhelmed by what we should do in this confusing time, I am once again reminded and encouraged that our church is exactly what this world needs more than ever.

How can I be so confident that we are what the world needs now? It's not that the programmatic offerings of St. James's are superior (though I do think we do some really cool stuff!). I am confident that we are becoming a people shaped and formed into a community of grace because of the promises of God. When we gather and center our lives on the life, death, and resurrection of Jesus as communicated to us in the scriptures and in the sacraments, we are transformed and then sent out into a world of need.

The gospel lesson we missed on Sunday, February 16 due to the storm was Jesus' Sermon on the Plain, as found in Luke 6. Jesus teaches his followers that the poor, the hungry, and those who weep are 'blessed.' Jesus inverts the expectations of this world and reshapes his followers into a new Lenten FORUMS SALT & LIGHT

community that is no longer centered on power, domination, and control. Instead, this Christ-like community is given a new heart of love, in which embracing others is prioritized. We are called into this 'blessed' life of open-heartedness, kindness, and generosity.

Every time we gather around the broken body and poured out blood of Jesus Christ at his table, we are once again transformed into this blessed community of love. We can then be sent out in his name to love and serve a broken world. It is completely fair to ask yourself why we do what we do on Sunday mornings. Wouldn't it just be more efficient to put all of our efforts into the community? But, we must gather together so that we can be patterned into the way of grace. I truly believe that we are in the process of becoming what the world needs. If we are to face the difficult challenges of the 2025 landscape, we must

allow for the deep and inward transformation that is building us into the 'blessed' community that Jesus envisions.

N January and February in KFC (Kid's for Christ or Sunday School) we studied the same lessons as the Gospel in the Lectionary. The children really enjoyed learning about the season of Epiphany, and on each Sunday we had great discussions about what the epiphany was in each story. By making a list on the white board in our classroom, the kids were able to remember the stories from week to week and retell them. It never ceases to amaze me how good the kids are at remembering and retelling. So amazing to see their Biblical knowledge grow from week to week. Now, we are on to Lent.

At KFC this Lent, we will explore Gospel passages that remind us that God is still with us through a curriculum from Illustrated Ministries. This is a curriculum I have purchased in the past, and I love the lessons and the coloring pages! In this curriculum we will explore the good news of the gospel—that Jesus experienced the fullness of humanity—comfort and pain, celebration and heartache, and joy and suffering, and when he had the choice to escape ridicule or rejection, Jesus stuck with the outsiders, the oppressed, and the hurting. We will talk about how the life of Jesus demonstrates that God knows what it is to be human and to be with us in all our experiences, especially in our suffering. Starting with the First Sunday in Lent and going through Easter, each weekly session will have a scripture passage, reflection and coloring pages which we will use during KFC. I think it will be great.

Coming on March 2, Diocesan Youth Group On the Move! This is a youth group sponsored by Camp Washington and hosted by Christ and Holy Trinity in Westport. We will have our own St. James's Youth Group on Sundays, March 16 and April 6 from 5 to 6:30. As I have said before, please encourage your middle and high schoolers to come and to bring friends if they like. When kids are friends with other kids at church it makes it much easier to get them out of bed on Sunday mornings! The earlier these relationships are established, the easier it is, which leads to more kids eager for confirmation and mission trips in the future.

Something to look forward to again this year is the Easter Egg Hunt after the service on Easter morning, April 20. This is a highlight of the church year and a wonderful time to celebrate as a congregation!

So, that is it. There is a lot coming up in the next two months. Make the most of it all, you and your family will be glad you did.





group. Please help these most at risk members of our community. The items listed are the most needed. These do not need to be "family size" items; 14-20 ounce containers are great and allow us to fit more items into the bags. The dollar stores are a good source for these sizes. Please consider buying fragrance-free or non-allergenic items. Children living in shelters often have asthma which is triggered by highly fragranced products.

Items needed: shampoo & conditioner; 2-in1 or 3-in-1 shampoo/ condition/body wash; moisturizer or hand cream; body wash; deodorant for men, women or uni-sex; bar soap (Dove and Ivory have fragrance-free options); toothpaste; disposable razors for men, women or uni-sex; shaving cream, dental floss, combs, lip balm, and mini Kleenex packs. Drop your donations off in the Cloister, or make a monetary donation and we will shop for you. Simply put "Easter Baskets" in the memo line.

Bring your donations to the church beginning in March. Join us as we gather to fill the bags on **Palm Sunday, April 13** after the 9:30am service in the parish hall. Thank you for your generosity!
