

From the Rector's Desk

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

I hope this letter finds you healthy and well in body, mind and spirit. As we enter yet another season in the midst of the COVID 19 pandemic, hoping you are well in body, mind and spirit might be a tough ask. I must say though, as of Easter, and looking forward to the summer, I do feel that we are experiencing, in many ways, small moments of resurrection in our lives. Many of us have had the opportunity to become fully vaccinated and it is my prayer that the rest of you are well on your way. My greatest concern at this time, is what this year plus has done to our psyches and our spirits. One of the overriding realities of COVID, other than the obvious fear of our physical health and of those we love, has been the sense of isolation and separation that so many of us have experienced, not being able to gather with friends and family and our spiritual community.

I know that many of you are feeling quite overwhelmed by your work and familial responsibilities and I do not want to add to your burden, but I do feel that for many of us, the best way through this time is together. While our bishops are strongly discouraging us from inperson indoors worship for now, the spring and summer weather allows us the opportunity to gather together for outdoor worship. We have been meeting at 11:00 outside for Spiritual Eucharist since Easter, and while social distancing and mask wearing can be rather annoying, and even in some ways disheartening, I have found these opportunities to be together spiritually significant and psychologically uplifting. I know it is not ideal, but I do think that gathering together outdoors on Sunday morning is a good way to live into the resurrection.

One of the other realities of this past year has been all the changes that have taken place in the lives of the children of our parish. They are a multitude, and you know what they are, so I won't bother you with a litany of them. So, beginning on May 2, Priscilla will be leading in-person KFC (Sunday School) in as close to the same format as pre-COVID as possible. Please see her write up in this newsletter about her plans.

This past year has been very hard on all of us. We have lost a number of beloved friends, family, and parishioners during this time, but we have also found ways to support each other and those in great need, living into our call as Christians.

We will continue to live stream the 9:30 service and hope that we can be indoors for that sooner rather than later, but in the meantime, I hope you will join us on the lawn at 11:00 Sunday morning (if you can please bring your own lawn chair) as we celebrate the resurrection of Jesus and the small resurrections in our lives that occur every day.



From the Organist & Choirmaster

EAR Parishioners,

When a stately home at 48 Orchard Road in West Hartford was recently offered for sale, the Noah Webster House seized on the opportunity to offer public tours of the 1931 Tudor revival dubbed "Seven Gables."

Seven Gables was built in by Ida Roberts, widow of industrialist George Roberts. Following her death, the house was sold to the Rev. George Guinness and his wife Catherine Spencer Guinness in 1940. The interesting part of this is that Catherine was previously married to the late Hobart Spencer, inventor and founder of the Spencer Turbine Company of Hartford. Hobart Spencer patented the hydraulic powered organ blower, the very first of which was installed at the previous St. James's Episcopal Church on Goodwin Green (located approximately where Omaha Steaks now resides).


For centuries, organists relied on human hands to pump the wind reservoirs necessary to supply pipe organs with air. While small organs required one pumper, large organs required multiple people. This was cumbersome because it made practicing and rehearsing very expensive if not cost prohibitive for most churches and musicians.

As cities across the country installed public water sources, Hobart Spencer realized that the hydraulic power now available at St James's and other churches would suffice to spin a wind turbine. These turbines revolutionized the organ building industry and made it possible for organists to practice when they liked.

As the national electric grid was installed, Spencer adapted his organ blowers to run from electric motors. The electric motors were capable of producing higher power outputs. He chose motors manufactured by the Woods Company. To this day, Woods motors are considered to be the finest ever made. Many legacy manufacturers and organs continue to use properly maintained Woods motors from 100 years ago. It is amazing to think that St James's was home to the first mechanical organ blower in the world!

N my May/June Newsletter last year, I talked about getting accustomed to a life separated from my friends, the students and staff at Morley, and especially my church community. I noted that there was one thing that I had learned and that was that words matter. I had just lost my mother and was thankful that I had let her know how much I loved her. A year later, those words ring truer than ever.

Last year at this time, I was just learning to manage the Zoom platform for my school job and my church job. At both meetings with school kids and church kids, I was hearing from them that they were thankful for typical things like, Legos, family and video games, but they were also mentioning that they were thankful for shelter, food, health and medical workers. They were letting me know that they understood that this was a scary situation. I was happy when we got together on Sunday mornings, they knew it was ok to share their fears and frustrations. Their words mattered to me, and I was honored that they shared them with me. That is all still true today.

Last year, however, I could never have foreseen what would happen between last April and this. The Black Lives Matter movement that has swept across the country, the election of President Joe Biden and the Georgia run-off, and the storming of the Capitol on January 6. Each time I listened to the news, I was more and more sure of how powerful our words are. Some in this country have used lies to spin a story that has been labeled, the Big Lie. And because people believe their leaders and the people in some areas of the media, the lies live on, causing more unrest and unfairness in our country. Sometimes it seems so hopeless. How can we move forward as a country and look out for each other? It is one thing to have different opinions, but we can't even agree on the facts. It worries me, to say the least. I was having difficulty finding joy as we approached Easter.

Yet, I still believe in my heart that our words matter—maybe now more than ever. So, I entered into Holy Week this year with a lot of sadness and unclarity. It was just after the anniversary of my mother's death, which as anyone who has lost someone knows, is a strange combination of relief and sadness. On Good Friday, Bob asked me to read the Solemn Collects, which I had never really paid attention to before and as our great Book of Common Prayer so often does, the words spoke to me and lifted me up. At the end of the Solemn Collects we pray: ...Let the whole world see that things which were cast down are being raised up, and things which had grown old are being made new, and that all things are being brought to their perfection by him through whom all things were made, your Son Jesus Christ our Lord; who lives and reigns with you, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God, forever and ever. Amen.

I'm not really sure why, but at that moment, these were just the words I needed to hear. Things that were being cast down are being raised up, and things which had grown old are being made new, and that ALL things are being brought to their perfection... We, as the body of Christ, are working to raise up all things that are cast down, aren't we? Aren't we working to bring all things into their perfection? We might not always get it done, but we are certainly trying, and at that time in that moment, those words helped me to carry on and continue the fight. I was suddenly filled with joy, and thankful for those prayerful words. Words matter. Choose yours wisely, tell the people in your life that you love them, and when you are searching for the words to pray, don't forget to look in your Book of Common Prayer.

Here are a few guidelines for parents to think about before bringing your children to church:


- Please make sure that your children have used the restroom before arriving at church.

Treasurer's Report / January-March 2021

Current Position: For the first three months of 2021 the Church's finances were positive vis a vis the budget. Total Income for that period was \$7,847 more than the budgeted amount and expenses were \$10,462 under budget. As a result, the Church's net financial position at the end of March, 2021 was a positive variance to budget of \$18,309.



Income: For the first three months of 2021 Regular Contributions (Current and Prior Year Pledges, Seasonal and Unspecified Offerings) in total were \$5,531 more than budget. Current Year Pledges were \$4,581more than the budget amount (increased by the recognition of \$33,635 of prepaid pledges) whereas Prior Year Pledges, Seasonal and Unspecified Offerings totaled \$950 more than budget. Income from outside groups using the Parish Facilities was \$785 over budget. Special Contributions were \$422 over budget.

Expenses: Major contributors to the January-March expense results were the following: Property expenses for the period were \$1,603 under budget due primarily to utility and insurance expenses that were less than budget. However, this may have been due to the timing of payments. Snow removal costs for the period were \$876. Personnel: Personnel expenses were \$3,175 under budget for the three month period due to less than budget Lay Staff salary and benefit expenses. Of the remaining expense categories, six were under budget and three were over, the net amount being \$8,890 over budget. However, \$6,501 of the overage is the result of the timing of the payment of the monthly Diocesan assessment. Our PPP Loan Forgiveness Application was submitted and we were subsequently advised that the Small Business Administration has paid the lender, Nutmeg State Federal Credit Union, the full amount of the loan. After the application of \$38,000 of available funds, the Capital Campaign loan balance will be reduced to \$156,000. Of the \$909,424 Capital Campaign pledges just \$31,877 remains outstanding.

With 1 in every 6 households currently suffering from food insecurity – for children the statistics are far worse – we at St. James's feel called to do our part to address this suffering. It is impossible to feed folks spiritually without considering their physical hunger as well.

"St. James's Cares" feeding program has now expanded to provide 28 full dinners for 4 each week to families struggling in the North End of Hartford through our partnership with our friends at The Hartford Catholic Worker. Your financial support makes it possible for us to provide dinners to 112 people (primarily children) every Monday. We will keep this going as long as we can – with no end in sight.

Mission Accomplished!

BIG thank you to Judith Stahl who once again did an amazing job in organizing and putting together the Easter baskets for our friends in need. Thank you to all who helped in the assembly, as well as all of you who donated toiletries. A total of 190 baskets were filled and delivered to men and women in local shelters just in time for Easter. Thank you for your generosity and making this mission project a huge success!


