

#### From the Associate Rector

Dear St. James's Family,

Alleluia! It's still Easter!

As we welcome the blossoming of spring in West Hartford, I hope you are making time to experience all of the ways that the Resurrection is happening around us, inviting us to never stop being Easter people.

Amazingly, the Good News Garden's Greenhouse is reminding us of that call to shine with God's glory. The greenhouse is already offering up all kinds of vegetables for our feeding ministries. In the past month, the garden team has harvested fresh carrots and greens and delivered them to our partners at the Grace Episcopal Church food pantry. This is exactly what we dreamed of when we decided to raise this greenhouse.

With that in mind, I want to remind you of our special Holy Eucharist on Rogation Sunday, May 5. At the 9:30 a.m. service we will worship, sing, share communion, and then exit the church together to bless the expanding Good News Garden as a faith family in Christ. I'm really excited that we will have this opportunity once again to pray together at different stations, including the outdoor planting beds, greenhouse, tool shed and the memorial garden, asking God's love to shine on these sacred spaces in our life together.

A bit of good news about the Good News Garden: The Episcopal Church in Connecticut recently awarded St. James's an entrepreneurial grant to finish paying off the greenhouse and to continue building a partnership with Grace Church in feeding the hungry in the Hartford area. In essence, the grant is a confirmation of our ministry. It also shows the desire of ECCT for other churches to follow our example by planting gardens on their properties at a time when one in ten Hartford area households still live with food insecurity.

In a move symbolic of Jesus's call for us to embrace the upside-down nature of God's love, we will continue to turn over sections of our lawn to build more planting beds on the Walden Street side of the church.

On Rogation Sunday, we will lay hands on the soil and bless the vegetable garden and greenhouse. The kids of St. James's will also get their hands dirty, planting a pollinator garden near the raised growing beds during KFC.

As we know from scripture, Jesus got his hands dirty to heal. (Remember the mud used to make "the man born blind" see?) There are a lot of ways for us to follow his example right here at St. James's. The most obvious is our Good News Garden ministry. You can get your hands in the mud and feel the heartbeat of our Creator, turning hunger and fear into comfort and hope. From the soil, from something ordinary and dirty, God's saving love emerges in the form of vegetables to feed the hungry. Isn't that like God's grace?

As we prepare for Rogation Sunday, know that you will be participating in a liturgy that traces its roots to the early Church. Rogation comes from the Latin "rogare" – to "ask for" God's blessings and mercy. The tradition began in Vienne, France, in 470, as the Roman Empire faded from history. A wave of natural disasters had decimated the town's crops. Rogationtide was the Church's liturgical response. In the sixth century, the observance of special rogation days of prayers for crops was ordered.


Traditionally, the fifth Sunday after Easter Sunday is Rogation Sunday. The following Monday, Tuesday, and Wednesday are "Rogation Days," which are dedicated to fasting and prayer leading up to Ascension Day.

In England, rogation days were associated with the blessing of the fields at planting. The vicar "beat the bounds" of the parish, processing around the fields reciting psalms and the litany. The liturgical tradition traveled to the U.S. colonies. In the United States, rogation days have long been associated with rural life, agriculture and fishing. The liturgical texts in the Book of Common Prayer were eventually expanded to include commerce, industry and the stewardship of creation.

I hope to see you on May 5 for Rogation Sunday.

EAR friends,

As I write this letter, the glorious swirl of sounds and sights from our Easter celebration continue to re-echo for me. From the flowering cross that anchored the choir gallery to our superb choirs and instrumentalists, an overflowing sanctuary, and palpable spirit of radiant joy, it was a day to remember indeed. Two young singers in our Junior Choir made their debuts as soloists; they sang beautifully and with a confidence and power that was inspiring. They were surrounded by more than a dozen of their friends in our Monday Music & More program; it's no exaggeration to say that each of those friends could potentially be a soloist one day as well! This group, our chorister group, and our adult choir overflow with talent and help lead us in worship with their passion and commitment. I am thankful! To punctuate all of this with the remarkable gifts of violinists John Kramer and Mindy Zhao, trumpeter John Charles Thomas and horn-player Barbara Hill made it all almost too good to be true. When the service ended, I wasn't the only one in the gallery who, more than anything, just wanted to do it all again!

We now look forward to our spring concert, anchored this year by a similarly inspiring crew of deeply gifted young musicians. Please plan to join us on Thursday, May 23 at 7:00 PM here in the sanctuary for music of Schumann, Rachmaninov, Duparc, Fauré, and more. Guest artists will include John and Samantha Kramer, violinists; Maggie Slap, cellist; Thomas Tarutin, violist and pianist; Mindy Zhao, violinist; Brian Joy, tenor; and Ben Dollar, tenor. I'm particularly thrilled to accompany both Ben and Brian and to hear them sing art songs they each have chosen for the evening. For Ben, it will be something of a valedictory celebration as he heads on to college in the fall. For me, it will offer an additional chance to celebrate the time I've been delighted to share with each of these musicians over my time here at St. James's. It's been a treat to open our two Christmas Concerts at two pianos with the blazingly-gifted Thomas Tarutin; working with (and getting to know) the Kramers has been a true career highlight and I've only had to make sure I've stopped myself from asking them to play too often! We planned the date of this concert around Samantha's and Maggie's return from college. They are beautiful players and you won't want to miss this chance to hear them.

Finally, as news is shared of a change in my role here at St. James's, I simply want to say an enormous thanks to our extended musical family and to the entire St. James's community for two and a half magnificent years together. This is a tough change for me since I so deeply enjoy my work here and since I've loved this community since well before I came to work as part of the staff on Ash Wednesday in 2022. 
