Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,



I know that, while my concerns are many, the people of St. James's will continue to be the folks they have always been.

While the political environment, the pandemic and so much more have stressed the system at home and at church, God continues to be good. I know this because I know you and each day I am reminded of that fact.

So, as we move forward please be patient; we are doing our best as I know you are. The link will go out in the proceeding Thursday's weekly Open Door and will be available on our website. EAR all,


Confirmation Class has had its first three meetings and we have a great class of 9 students, plus our talented assistant teacher, Nora Willson! Nora is helping me lead the potential confirmands in exploring what it means to make a public affirmation of Christian faith and a reaffirmation of Baptismal vows. We have talked about what the Gospel is, why it's essential to see Christianity as an outgrowth of Judaism, and what evil is. These have been riveting discussions and I am continually impressed by the level of depth and curiosity the students bring to class. Even in tough times, they are remaining intellectually and spiritually curious and engaged! This past class, the students signed the official, framed Confirmation Commitment Pledge, which will hang somewhere on the church grounds. In the pledge, they promise to attend Confirmation sessions, help fundraise for their mission trip in Summer 2022, be involved in Holy Week services, memorize a psalm at least 10 verses in length, attend Confirmation service even if they are not confirmed, and participate in planning the service itself. I look forward to more exciting and thoughtful discussions with the group as we near the holiday season and Advent.

In other news, I have been talking with several of our senior men and women on the phone and they continue to face the challenges of Covid with hope and honesty.

Please stay tuned for news on the adult education offering with St. John's - "Sacred Ground," a film-based dialogue series on Race and Faith.

# From the Organist & Choirmaster

ear Parishioners,

As we enter the final weeks of the 2020, I am glad to report that our weekly handbell choir rehearsals continue to find success. Our youth handbell choir meets from 5:15 -6:30pm on Wednesdays, followed by the adult handbell choir from 7-9pm. Both groups have enthusiastically embraced handbell ringing and I've had an equal amount of fun leading the groups.

For a while, especially over the summer, the question of when we resume singing has been on everyone's mind. I think we are still wise to hold off on singing indoors until public health experts give the green light. Even now, health professionals at Yale University School of Medicine suggest that the air inside gathering places such as ours be replaced three or more times an hour when occupied by groups. This reinforces the need to mitigate the risk from a highly contagious, airborne virus. Anything we can do to lower the risk is a help.


Bob, Tim and I currently find ourselves in a holding pattern as we wait for the final pieces of our webcasting equipment to arrive from overseas. While the cabling and one camera are already in place, the two PTZ cameras at the front of the nave are needed to finish the project and begin livestreaming. These cameras could arrive any day now, or they could take a few more weeks – the shipping estimate is unknown even to our contractor. But once these cameras are in place, we will have a better sense of how to plan liturgy for the months ahead.

It has been wonderful to see many of you at our weekly outdoor service. We all miss our indoor gatherings, and I particularly miss playing familiar hymns and hearing the congregation sing. Time does still seem to fly, so I hope we may resume our regular life together before too long.

S we head into November and December, there is a lot of activity for children here at St. James's. In KFC-to-go or Kids' Liturgy on Sunday mornings, we have been exploring many of Jesus' parables- the Good Samaritan, the Lost Sheep, the Mustard Seed, the Prodigal Son and many more in September and October. Children have begun to see Jesus' theme of God's unending love for us. In November, we will be studying some Old Testament lessons, Abraham and Sarah, Solomon and Esther before we head into Advent. During the four Sundays of Advent we will explore the ideas of Hope, Peace, Joy & Love. We will also offer the weekly book readings, as well.

After much thought and prayer, I am excited to announce that we will offer a Virtual Christmas pageant this year. I won't bother to explain all the technical aspects, but these talented young women are putting together a combination of Zoom recordings, selfrecordings and photo montages. This recording will also include music by the bell choirs and solos led by Vaughn Mauren. We will set up the video to premier at a certain time on Christmas Eve so everyone can watch the pageant at the same time. It will also be available after the premier.





# Treasurer's Report / January-September 2020

**Current Position:** The Church's total Income for the nine months ending September 30, 2020 was \$52,085 less than the budgeted amount and expenses were \$22,256 under budget. As a result, the Church's net financial

position at the end of September, 2020 was a negative variance to budget of \$29,829.

<u>Income</u>: For the nine months period, Regular Contributions (Current and Prior Year Pledges, Seasonal and Unspecified Offerings) in total were \$37,541 less than budget. The breakdown of this amount shows that Current Year pledges were behind budget by \$24,928 and Prior Year Pledges, Seasonal and Unspecified Offerings totaled \$12,613 less than budget. Income from outside groups using the Parish Facilities was \$10,505 under budget. Special Contributions were \$2,902 less than budget.

Expenses: Major contributors to the January – September expense results were the following: Property: Property expenses for the period were \$7,183 under budget. Maintenance supplies, lawn care and snow removal were \$5,133 under budget. General maintenance expenses were \$2,336 over budget and utilities were \$4,700 under budget. Personnel: Personnel expenses were \$137 under budget for the nine month period. All ten of the remaining expense categories were under budget by the aggregate amount of \$14,936. The monthly Treasurer's report is intended to show how the Church's financial performance during the year is tracking with its budget forecast. The report does not account for the Paycheck Protection Program loan proceeds of \$70,314.77 that the Church received on May 12, 2020 because those monies were not included in the Vestry approved budget for 2020. The period for spending the PPP loan proceeds will expire October 30, 2020 and thereafter the Church will apply for forgiveness of the entire amount of the loan.

# Moving Forward Update

We continue to make plans for indoor worship together when it is safe to do so. This reminder update is meant to give you an idea of what is



happening now, and what might happen next.

ORK continues to bring the St. James's community together in whatever ways are possible both now and into the future. Our driving goal is to provide for the spiritual life of all parishioners. Here is what we know:

For now we continue to have Morning prayer at home, which can be found on the homepage and in weekly email, and a YouTube video service each week. We will also continue to offer the Outside @10:00 spiritual eucharist on the Walden Street side of the church, weather permitting. We have also added Wednesday Morning Prayer via Zoom at 8am beginning November 4 with the Rev. Tim O'Leary. Look for the links in weekly emails or by going to the website. Click the Discipleship tab then Morning Prayer via Zoom. This schedule will continue until we have the ability to "live stream" church services, followed by CDC-regulated in-person services when that becomes safe. Once we get live streaming up and running, we will continue this as a regular offering. This means anyone who cannot physically attend church for any reason will always be able to participate.

That is a lot of information – here are some **Frequently Asked Questions** to clarify what we are planning:

## How can I go to church right now?

Each Sunday there will be a YouTube video service and an outdoor spiritual eucharist offered at 10am. The videos remain on YouTube so you can watch or re-watch anytime you like. We have also added Wednesday Morning Prayer at 8am via Zoom. Links to these services can be found on the website and in weekly emails. Please look for the weekly emails for details and what is happening when.

## What is "live streaming"?

Live streaming is not a recorded video, but a real-time video feed broadcast from the church during a live service. In the short -term these services will not include parishioners in attendance, but when that is determined to be safe, there will be in-person services that will also be live streamed for those who cannot attend.

### How do I access the live stream broadcast?

When available, access will be as easy as going to our website and clicking on the Livestream button on the home page. There will be no need to navigate Zoom or Facebook or any other program. You can use a computer, laptop, tablet, phone, or any other device that can access the internet.

# Will I be able to watch these videos at a different time, after the service?

Yes, these broadcasts will be recorded and available on YouTube after a brief delay. Perhaps the day after the service. Links will be available on the website for Livestream and YouTube services.

# When will it be "determined to be safe" to have in-person services?

We do not have a specific date for in-person services. We will continue to monitor the public health situation and take steps slowly and carefully, erring on the side of safety and not rushing to meet any particular date. Please be patient as we make these decisions with great care and attention to detail.

## Are specific supplies needed before we can have services inperson?

YES! We need Clorox disposable wipes, or any other equivalent non bleach-based wipes. Greatly appreciated donations may be dropped outside the cloister entrance to the building. Thank you!

# How will in-person services be different than they were before?

There are several ways we know of, and likely some we have not figured out yet. We will follow all CDC guidelines for religious services. Precautions will include:

- Communion: In the near-term there will be no communion.
   The bishops have advised us not to have communion in its traditional sense and that seems prudent. Instead we will continue to use the service we have been using for the videos. It is an Adapted Version of Eucharistic Prayer B, for a time when gathering with bread and wine is not possible.
- Symptom checks: Please consider your health, and the health of your family members before you decide to attend church. If you have a fever, cough, have spent time recently where the virus is circulating, or have any condition that puts you at higher risk of contracting severe Covid-19, please choose not to attend in-person services. Live streaming will be available for anyone who cannot or should not attend services.
- Music: There will be no singing at services right now.
   Scientific studies have shown that singing increases the range that individuals project particles and has been a major factor in super-spreader events. Vaughn has been working with the Handbell Choir and continues to offer beautiful instrumental music for the online service and soon available livestream services.
- Social distancing: This will require limited (1 out of every 3 pews) and likely assigned seats. Ushers will direct you to the next available pew so that we can accommodate as many attendees as possible. Seating will start at the front of the church and move backwards. Please accept your seating assignment and any other direction from the ushers without question. They will be specially trained to keep everyone as safe as possible.
- Face masks: Face coverings will be required for all attendees.
   A dedicated group of parishioners has been busy sewing masks to provide to anyone who needs one. Please wear your own face covering if you have one available that works well for you.
- Passing the Plate: Offering plates will be placed at the entrance for donations. If you are one of the many parishioners paying your pledges by mail during these times, please continue to do so. If you have not tried this solution, please consider it. Contributions should be mailed to St. James's Episcopal Church, 19 Walden Street, West Hartford CT 06107.
- Timing: To allow for proper seating, we will ask you to arrive 15 minutes prior to service time. There will likely be only one service each Sunday.


